


BUS PASSES

We do this because all students travel throughout the building to specialist classes, assemblies, water filling stations, playground, etc, and the only way to provide the safest environment is to

exclude all peanut and other nut products from lunches and snacks. This means that imitation peanut butter products such as WOW Butter are prohibited as well.

"HELP MY CHILD" Panel Discussion topics/speakers will include:

- 1. What is Home & School? David Schult, Former international school teacher and administrator having worked overseas for over 24 years, in seven countries before returning to Canada in 2021, will provide background and context to what Home and School is and does.
- 2. **COMPASS Student Health Survey! Cody Davenport,** PEI COMPASS Research Project Lead, PEI Chief Public Health Office, will present student health survey results about their health and health behaviours including sedentary behaviours, physical activity, mental health, healthy eating, substance use, bullying, academic outcomes, and sleep.
